Following these simple guidelines will help us ensure that 911 is available when it is **TRULY** needed!!!

**When to Dial 911:**

- \* **Crimes in PROGRESS; Assaults, Fights, Robberies, Burglaries, etc.**
- \* **Accidents with injuries (or if roadway is blocked)**
- \* **Medical EMERGENCIES ( Where Life is in Danger)**
- \* **Fires in or near buildings or vehicles, or large field fires**
- \* **Hazardous Chemical spills**
- \* **Boats sinking (with people on board)**
- \* **Any situation where life or property is in IMMEDIATE danger of harm**

**When NOT to Dial 911:**

Please do NOT call 911 when.....

- \* Reporting crimes that happened earlier and are NOT currently in progress
- \* Requesting medical assistance for general illness that is NOT life threatening
- \* Notifying of Controlled burns
- \* Reporting accidents on private property or not blocking roadway and where there are no injuries
- \* Making noise complaints (including barking dogs)
- \* Requesting information about open cases or for general information or taxes
- \* Inquiring about road conditions ( Call 1-800-459-7623) or for directions
- \* Inquiring about Weather conditions (Call your local television or radio station)
- \* Reporting abandoned vehicles or boats
- \* .... calling 928-2122 would be a toll call
